NASAL BLEEDING

Description:	Exit of drops or abundant quantity of blood from nostrils. It could be a consequence of a facial trauma.
Is it an emergency?	Yes, the patient must be seen rapidly, since vital risk exists.
Test to be done:	The diagnosis is confirmed by the direct examination of the nostrils or by Diagnoses Sinusoscopy 's help under local anaesthesia in order to locate the exact bled's place or to discover a fracture.
Procedure done in office:	Nasal mucosa Electrocoagulation with radiofrequency and sinusoscopy. This procedure consists of locating, under local anaesthesia, the exact place where the artery or the vein is bleeding, and proceeding to treat with electrode 'burning'. This procedure replaces the inconvenient and painful Nasal packing technique.
Procedure done in the operating room:	Nasal's bone fracture Reduction. Only in fracture's confirmation cases. General anesthesia is required.
